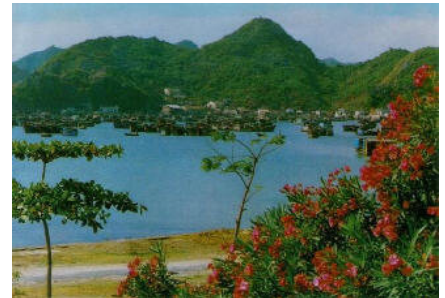

## STUDENTS ENJOY SUN, SEA AND SCIENCE ON BIOLOGY FIELD TRIP!

A number of Yeovil College Biology students are currently in Vietnam for the 11<sup>th</sup> annual Biology field trip, run in conjunction with Strode College.

The students left on 14<sup>th</sup> August for Seoul, the capital of South Korea, before travelling to Vietnam itself. They have been on a range of excursions to explore a variety of habitats and environments since then, including visits to the Cuc Phuong National Park Primate Centre and Botanical Gardens, sailing on Ha Long Bay to Cat Ba Island a visit to an animal preservation centre and pre-historic caves



Other activities have included a site-seeing trip to a traditional folk village, a city-cycle tour of Hanoi, trekking in the Kim Giao Forest and exploring the Cat Ba coast.

The students will return home at the end of this month after visits to Ho Chi Minh City, where they will explore China Town and the Cu Chi tunnels. They will also have the opportunity to study the salt marsh and mangrove habitats on Vam Sat National Park, rainforest ecology in the Nam Cat Tien National Park and underwater environments at the Puerto Galera Reef.

This is the 11<sup>th</sup> annual field trip of this type. Previous destinations have included Malaysia, Borneo, The Bahamas, Sri Lanka, Costa Rica, Tanzania, New Zealand and Australia.
